# **Evangelistic Outreach**

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (Matthew 28:19-20)

## Introduction:

Next to personally knowing Jesus and walking with Him, one of the greatest blessings of the Christian life is to actually lead someone to Jesus Christ. The good news is that God wants to use you – not just pastors, missionaries, and evangelists – as His instrument to speak to others. Jesus gave us this very commission in Mark 16:15, where He says, "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone, everywhere." This wonderful charge is known as the "great commission." But the way some Christians follow it, you would think it was the "great suggestion." Sharing our faith, however, is something that Jesus wants – and commands – us to do! I Peter 3:15-16 tells us to be ready to give an answer to anyone who asks us about the hope we have in Jesus.

3 tips for being a witness (see Acts 22:1-21)

- 1. It was incredibly clear.
  - -Who art thou, Lord?
  - -What shall I do, Lord?
- 2. It was surprisingly **brief**.

#### He stated:

- -Who he was (vs. 1-5) Problem
- -Who he met (vs. 6-13) Solution
- -Who he became (vs. 14-21) Change
- 3. It was refreshingly specific.

- c. Practice with a Christian friend; let them evaluate.
