Chapter 9: Why Attend the Ordinances of the Church?

Introduction:

For people who claim to be Christians, attending the worship of God with the people of God should always be a priority. But knowing that tone of the ordinances of the church will be observed should only add to your determination to be there.

I. What are the ordinances? (I Corin. 11; Matthew 3)

- A. A ceremony that the Lord Jesus Christ has <u>commanded</u> to be permanently practiced by the church (Matt. 28:19; Luke 22:19)
- B. Ordinances are ceremonies given by Christ to the church, and not to <u>individual</u> Christians. (I Cor. 11:23-26)

II. Why attend the ordinance of baptism? (Matt. 28:19-20)

- A. You Demonstrate commitment to the great commission.
 - 1. Those who become His disciples should <u>openly</u> identify themselves with Him in a specific way.
 - 2. If you are committed to the Great Commission, then you will prove it by your presence.
- B. You show commitment to the importance of baptism. (Acts 2:38)
- C. You accept a new member into the family. (Rom. 15:7)

III. Why attend the ordinance of the Lord's Supper?

- A It is commanded by Jesus. (I Cor. 11:23-26)
- B. It is loved by Jesus. (Luke 22:15)
- C. It is spiritual participation in the body and blood of Jesus. (Acts 2:42)
- D. It is a memorial to Jesus. (I Cor. 11:24-25)
- E. It is a proclamation of the death of Jesus. (I Cor. 11:26)
- F. It is an anticipation of the second coming of Jesus. (I Cor. 11:26)

IV. Other considerations.

- A. Participating in the ordinances does not make you a Christian. (Titus 3:5-6)
- B. Participating in the ordinances is more important than almost every <u>reason</u> people give for not participating in them.
- C. Participating in the ordinances is necessary and a blessing. (Ps. 119:68)
