Chapter 10: Why Fellowship with the Church?

Introduction:

Consistent and life-sustaining fellowship in the New Testament is inseparably joined to intimacy within a believing community. The first description of life in the first church: "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship. . ."

I. Fellowship with the church is a unique privilege. (I Cor. 1:9; Philippians 3:10)

- A. The unique blessing of Christian fellowship.
 - 1 We share a common gift—the <u>indwelling</u> presence of the Holy Spirit. (II Cor. 13:14, Phil. 2:1)
 - 2. Christian fellowship involves the sharing of spiritual life. (I John 1:3)
- B. The subject matter of Christian fellowship. (Hebrews 10:25)

II. Fellowship with the church provides unique benefits.

- A. You experience the grace of God in ways you otherwise cannot. (Acts 2:42)
- B. You experience the gifts and grace given to others. (I Peter 4:10; Eph. 4:11-16)
- C. Your <u>practice</u> of the spiritual disciplines is encouraged. (Heb. 3:13)
- D. You experience <u>love</u> in ways you otherwise cannot. (John 13:34, 15:12; I John 3:23)

III. More scriptural truths about fellowship.

- A. The need for fellowship with the church is undeniable.
 - 1. Spiritual people need to talk about spiritual things.
 - 2. The <u>strength</u> of your spiritual fire is related to the fellowship you have with the body of Christ.
- B. The neglect of fellowship with the church is sinful. (Heb. 10:24-25)
- C. The privilege of fellowship with the church is costly. (I John 1:3)
 - 1. It will cost you time.
 - 2. It may cost <u>initiative</u> or hospitality.
- D. The pursuit of fellowship with the church is worthwhile. (Prov. 18:24)
