I. God was pleased to ordain preaching. (I Cor. 1:21)

- A. Why preaching: It pleased God.

II. God could have chosen other ways to communicate His message.

- A. He had tens of thousands of angels. (Luke 2:9-14)
- B. He created and controls the stars.
- C. Calligraphy of the clouds.
- D. Speak directly from heaven every morning. (John 12:28-30)
- E. Pictures books or drawings.

III. The meaning of preaching.

- A. The proclamation of God's truth by any and every legitimate means. (I Cor. 1:21)
- B. The <u>ordination</u> of preaching.
 - 1. He spoke through the preaching of prophets. (Matt. 10:7)
 - 2. Preaching was and is the method explicitly appointed by God.
 - 3. Preaching is always relevant because it is timeless, trans-cultural, and simple.
 - a. All that is needed for preaching in any place, in any culture, at any time, is a preacher, the <u>Word</u> of God, and listeners.
 - b. The most <u>effective</u> means of communicating the gospel is through preaching.
